Presenters

Janice E. Brunstrom-Hernandez, M.D., Keynote Speaker



Dr. Janice Brunstrom-Hernandez, Pediatric Neurologist, is the founder and director of the Pediatric Neurology Cerebral Palsy Center at Washington University School of Medicine and St. Louis Children's Hospital. Over the past decade, she and her colleagues have provided comprehensive, pro- active, multi-disciplinary care to more than 2,000 patients from all over the U.S. and around the world. Her innovative approach includes a strong emphasis on physical fitness, and she has launched programs in martial arts and sports for young people with CP. She is also actively involved in developing and testing new treatment strategies, particularly for the management of spasticity.

Dr. Brunstrom-Hernandez has grown up challenging the myths, stereotypes, and negative expectations about her own CP, including experts' predictions that she would never walk or talk, never attend college, and never have children. She continues to challenge her colleagues and all those involved in the care of children with CP to work together to remove obstacles and create more opportunities so that every child has the chance to achieve their highest potential in life.

Lunchtime Program



Tamar Rogoff, a choreographer, and Gregg Mozgala, an actor and writer, were featured in news and television stories for their groundbreaking work in Ms. Rogoff's original dance piece, "Diagnosis of a Faun," which ran for 3 weeks in December 2009 at LaMama, ETC in New York City. In it, Ms. Rogoff cast an actual surgeon, two professional dancers, and the talented Gregg Mozgala, who has cerebral palsy. It is the "journey" the two of them took to transform Mr. Mozgala into a dancer, that is the subject of our after-lunch program.

As a choreographer, Ms. Rogoff explores the outer limits of how people negotiate extreme circumstances, often combining her art with history, anthropology and science. "Diagnosis of a Faun" will run at the Kennedy Center and Middlebury College in 2010. Ms. Rogoff plans to make a feature documentary that follows the year-long training and rehearsal process as it takes Gregg Mozgala from the studio to the stage.

Gregg Mozgala has acted extensively Off-Off and Off Broadway as well as regionally and internationally. As a writer, his plays have been presented and/or produced at the NY International Fringe Festival, Ensemble Studio Theatre, Visible Theatre, Nicu's Spoon and Theatre Breaking Through Barriers.
